We are optimists. We work to spread hope for a PINK future and to strengthen the fight for democracy in Israel, using a variety of forms of art, such as music and visual means. Our protest is not violent, but is very determined. It reflects ideas by sending clear, precise, and straightforward messages to a crowd of supporters that grows on a weekly basis.

Why PINK? PINK cannot be a symbol for fascism and evil. We all know this deep down in our hearts. PINK is a color that reflects sensitivity, softness, compassion, childhood, love, hope and optimism – the future that each and every one in Israel and all around the world deserves.




These days, THE PINK FRONT is at the front and center of the most important civil struggle in the history of the state of Israel. The leaders of the movement are young activists from the arts, humanities, and the academy in the Israeli society. Our activists and supporters come from diverse professional backgrounds, from all over the country and all age groups; starting from teenagers and up to young souls at more advanced ages.



THE PINK FRONT is one of the most memorable and recognizable movements in the current civic fight for liberty, democracy and equality. Our movement is growing rapidly, and currently has more than 3,500 active members.

We are proud to lead the marches in Tel Aviv and other parts of the country, singing and beating our drums. We are proud of the original and humorous, yet focused, messages that we bring to the protests. Our artistic performances are heart touching and thought provoking, leading our audience to reflect about the situation and to hope for a PINK future.





We are reaching out to you today asking for your help and support. We do our best to fight against the anti-democratic coup promoted by the current Israeli government, and against the resulting threats to human and civil rights, to equality, to justice and to fraternity. We are determined to protect our beloved country in our PINK way. We have already managed to expand our PINK activity in terms of volume, power and visibility, but we want to do much more.

Our work and activity involve handing out equipment (such as loudspeakers and drums) to protesters before each protest, producing artistic performances, and opening and supporting new branches of THE PINK FRONT in other cities and parts of the country. We are also establishing the "PINK YOUTH" group in Tel Aviv: more and more teenagers join us regularly in the protests, taking active roles (with a close watch and supervision of their parents and THE PINK FRONT activists). We also support protests and activities outside of Tel Aviv. Members from the PINK FRONT Tel Aviv branch travel to smaller cities and towns, including some in rural areas, reaching out to the locals in an effort to recruit new activists and supporters. In addition, we produce special events - for example, staying for a few days camping at Sacher park in Jerusalem ahead of the vote in the Knesset about canceling the reasonableness standard.

We have great and ambitious plans for a PINK future, for short- and long-term, in order to ensure that Israel remains a liberal and Jewish democracy.
